Directions

From M4 (east)

At Exit 19 take M32 towards Bristol
Take first exit and turn west (right) on A4174 towards Filton At second roundabout turn left on A38 towards Bristol

From M4 (west)

At Exit 20 take M5 south towards South West

From M5 (north or south)

At Exit 16 take A38 south towards Filton and Bristol
Straight on at Aztec roundabout and after 2 miles straight on at second roundabout on A38 towards Bristol
From A38 take second left (after 150 yds) into Elm Park and follow signs (next left) to Filton Leisure and Folk Centre

15. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
17. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. No prize money is on offer
20. Dogs in Cars on Hot Days. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog
If you dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused
21. Welfare of Dogs

A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for Disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts traveling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When traveling to a show please take moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether traveling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
